# The Sunday of the Passion: Palm Sunday

April 2, 2023 9:00 a.m.

*The congregation will gather in the church Narthex  
for The Liturgy of the Palms.*

## The Liturgy of the Palms

**Presider:** Blessed is the King who comes in the name of the Lord.

**People:** **Peace in heaven and glory in the highest.**

**Presider:** Assist us mercifully with your help, O Lord God of our salvation, that we may enter with joy upon the contemplation of those mighty acts, whereby you have given us life and immortality; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

**Reader:** Matthew 21:1-11

When Jesus and his disciples had come near Jerusalem and had reached Bethphage, at the Mount of Olives, Jesus sent two disciples, saying to them, "Go into the village ahead of you, and immediately you will find a donkey tied, and a colt with her; untie them and bring them to me. If anyone says anything to you, just say this, 'The Lord needs them.' And he will send them immediately."

This took place to fulfill what had been spoken through the prophet, saying,

"Tell the daughter of Zion,  
Look, your king is coming to you,  
humble, and mounted on a donkey,  
and on a colt, the foal of a donkey."

The disciples went and did as Jesus had directed them; they brought the donkey and the colt, and put their cloaks on them, and he sat on them. A very large crowd spread their cloaks on the road, and others cut branches from the trees and spread them on the road. The crowds that went ahead of him and that followed were shouting,

"Hosanna to the Son of David!  
Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord!  
Hosanna in the highest heaven!"

When he entered Jerusalem, the whole city was in turmoil, asking, "Who is this?" The crowds were saying, "This is the prophet Jesus from Nazareth in Galilee."

**Presider:** The Lord be with you.

**People:**        **And also with you.**

**Presider:** Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

**People:**        **It is right to give him thanks and praise.**

**Presider:** It is right to praise you, Almighty God, for the acts of love by which you have redeemed us through your Son Jesus Christ our Lord. On this day he entered the holy city of Jerusalem in triumph, and was proclaimed as King of kings by those who spread their garments and branches of palm along his way. Let these branches be for us signs of his victory, and grant that we who bear them in his name may ever hail him as our King, and follow him in the way that leads to eternal life; who lives and reigns in glory with you and the Holy Spirit, now and for ever. **Amen.**

**Presider:** Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.

**People:** **Hosanna in the highest.**

The palms are now distributed.

**Presider:** Let us go forth in peace.

**People:** In the Name of Christ. Amen.

## The Procession

## Psalm 118

(Psalm 118 is read by all during the procession. The order of the procession into the sanctuary is: Crucifer, Choir, People, Presider.)

Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good;  
his mercy endures for ever.

Let Israel now proclaim,  
"His mercy endures for ever."

Open for me the gates of righteousness;  
I will enter them;  
I will offer thanks to the Lord.

"This is the gate of the Lord;  
he who is righteous may enter."

I will give thanks to you, for you answered me  
and have become my salvation.

The same stone which the builders rejected  
has become the chief cornerstone.

This is the Lord's doing,  
and it is marvelous in our eyes.

On this day the Lord has acted;  
we will rejoice and be glad in it.

Hosannah, Lord, hosannah!  
Lord, send us now success.

Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord;  
we bless you from the house of the Lord.

God is the Lord; he has shined upon us;  
form a procession with branches up to the horns of the altar.

"You are my God, and I will thank you;  
you are my God, and I will exalt you."

Give thanks to the Lord, for he is good;  
his mercy endures for ever.

(Crucifer and Presider stop at the back of the church. When all are in and Psalm 118 has ended, the Presider reads the following from the back of the church.)

### **The Collect for the Sunday of the Passion**

**Presider:** Almighty God, whose most dear Son went not up to joy but first he suffered pain, and entered not into glory before he was crucified: Mercifully grant that we, walking in the way of the cross, may find it none other than the way of life and peace: through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

a dismay to those of my acquaintance;  
when they see me in the street they avoid me.

**People:** I am forgotten like a dead man, out of mind;  
I am as useless as a broken pot.

**Reader:** For I have heard the whispering of the crowd;  
fear is all around;  
they put their heads together against me;  
they plot to take my life.

**People:** But as for me, I have trusted in you, O Lord.  
I have said, "You are my God.

**Reader:** My times are in your hand;  
rescue me from the hand of my enemies,  
and from those who persecute me.

**People: Make your face to shine upon your servant,  
and in your loving-kindness save me."**

## **The Epistle**

Philippians 2:5-11

Let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus,  
who, though he was in the form of God,  
did not regard equality with God  
as something to be exploited,  
but emptied himself,  
taking the form of a slave,  
being born in human likeness.  
And being found in human form,  
he humbled himself  
and became obedient to the point of death--  
even death on a cross.  
Therefore God also highly exalted him  
and gave him the name  
that is above every name,  
so that at the name of Jesus  
every knee should bend,  
in heaven and on earth and under the earth,  
and every tongue should confess  
that Jesus Christ is Lord,  
to the glory of God the Father.


