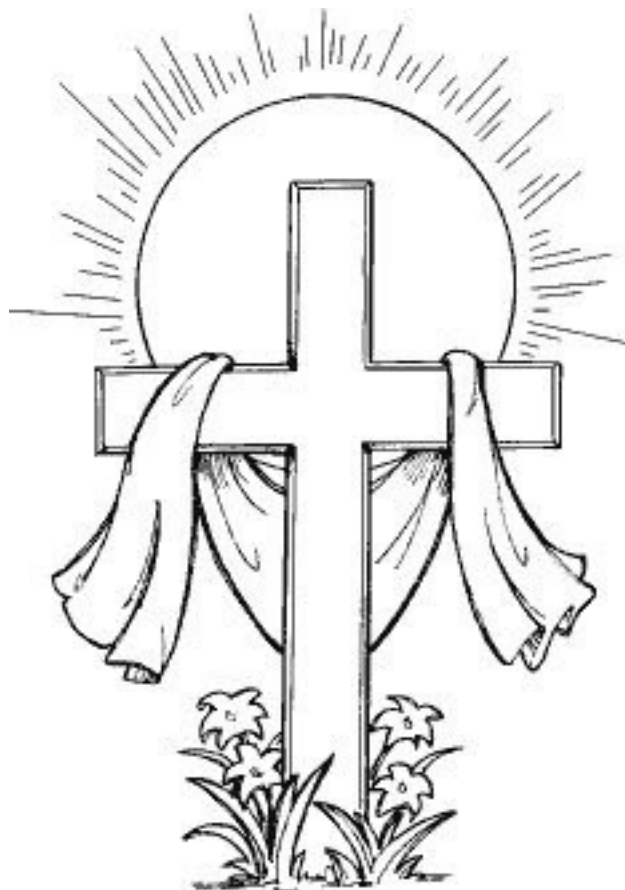

## The First Reading

Acts 10:34-43

Peter began to speak to Cornelius and the other Gentiles: "I truly understand that God shows no partiality, but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him. You know the message he sent to the people of Israel, preaching peace by Jesus Christ -- he is Lord of all.

"That message spread throughout Judea, beginning in Galilee after the baptism that John announced: how God anointed Jesus of Nazareth with the Holy Spirit and with power; how he went about doing good and healing all who were oppressed by the devil, for God was with him. We are witnesses to all that he did both in Judea and in Jerusalem. They put him to death by hanging him on a tree; but God raised him on the third day and allowed him to appear, not to all the people but to us who were chosen by God as witnesses, and who ate and drank with him after he rose from the dead.

He commanded us to preach to the people and to testify that he is the one ordained by God as judge of the living and the dead. All the prophets testify about him that

everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name."

### **Matthew 28: 1-10**

After the sabbath, as the first day of the week was dawning, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary went to see the tomb. And suddenly there was a great earthquake; for an angel of the Lord, descending from heaven, came and rolled back the stone and sat on it. His appearance was like lightning, and his clothing white as snow. For fear of him the guards shook and became like dead men. But the angel said to the women, "Do not be afraid; I know that you are looking for Jesus who was crucified. He is not here; for he has been raised, as he said. Come, see the place where he lay. Then go quickly and tell his disciples, 'He has been raised from the dead, and indeed he is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him.' This is my message for you." ## The Prayers of the People

*(Adapted from Intercessions for the Christian People)*

**Priest:** Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! At this the  
heavenly choirs of angels rejoice, the earth exults,  
and mother church is glad.

Therefore I ask you, who praise the loving-kindness of almighty God, to join in prayer for all of God's people, and for all people everywhere according to their needs. That all may know the benefits of the paschal victory of Christ, we pray, saying: Lord, in your mercy, hear our prayer.

**Reader:** Almighty and merciful God, we give you thanks for those who have come through the waters of rebirth into the promised land of your eternal kingdom. Guide all your baptized people who struggle to know and to do your will in the kingdoms of this world, that by their lives they may show forth the new life in Christ to all nations. Lord, in your mercy,

**People: Hear our prayer.**

**Reader:** We give you thanks for those who struggle for peace and justice in the world. Guide their efforts, that they may act with prudence and vision to plant the signs of your dominion in the earth. Lord, in your mercy,

**People: Hear our prayer.**

**Reader:** We give you thanks for the abiding presence of your Son in word and sacrament. As we feast this Easter Day on the true bread from heaven, set our

minds on things above, that we may gain a new perspective on the things that are on earth. Lord, in your mercy,

**People: Hear our prayer.**

**Reader:** We give you thanks that Mary Magdalene found healing in the encounter with the risen Christ. Give wholeness and peace to all those in need: the sick, the unloved and the forgotten, the poor and the hungry, the dying and the bereaved and *all who have commended themselves to us for prayer, [especially N.]*. Lord, in your mercy,

**People: Hear our prayer.**

**Reader:** We give you thanks for the brave men and women working and living in harm's way, that they be protected and strengthened. Lord, in your mercy.

**People: Hear our prayer.**

**Reader:** We give you thanks for those who have gone before us in the faith, who now rest from their labors awaiting the resurrection to eternal life, *[especially N. and for those for whom the Easter Flowers have been given]*. May we, like them, remain faithful to the end and share in the fruits of

the victory of Christ, the paschal lamb who takes away the sin of the world. Lord, in your mercy,

**People: Hear our prayer.**

**Reader:** Let us pray for our congregation and our Vestry as we seek a new priest for our faith community. Guide us and give us wisdom and patience, that we may discern thy will for us, and that we will call a priest who will inspire us, care for us and bring us closer to thee.

**People: Lord hear our prayer.**

**Reader:** Let us pray for the churches in the Diocesan Cycle of Prayer:

St. Peter's, Milford; Trinity, Milton; St. Peter's Grace, Monroe; and Hospital chaplains; Stephen Ministers; pastoral care groups; ministries of healing; nurses; wellness program; recovery ministries.

**People: Lord hear our prayer.**

**Reader:** Let us pray for peace in the world:

**God of peace and justice, we pray for peace in the world. We pray for those with power over war or peace, for wisdom, discernment and**

compassion to guide their decisions. We pray for those in all countries at risk and in fear. We pray for those who protect and defend our country. May your kingdom of justice and peace reign throughout the world. Amen.

**Priest:** Hear our prayers on behalf of those for whom we pray, and give us peace in this time of our paschal rejoicing, for the sake of your Son, Jesus Christ, our risen and exalted Lord. **Amen.**

Accept these prayers and praises, Father, through Jesus Christ our great High Priest, to whom, with you and the Holy Spirit, your Church gives honor, glory, and worship, from generation to generation. **Amen.**
